We hosted our third set of Green Iowa AmeriCorps interns who helped restore our prairie, created fun play equipment in our Nature Playscape and established a plant identification tower for the Center.

We planted more than 400 trees. Each tree on our land generates enough oxygen for four people. With several thousand trees and 20 acres of prairie, Prairiewoods contributes oxygen for every person living in Hiawatha and absorbs an estimated 200,000 pounds of carbon every year.

"As the Chair of the Prairiewoods Board of Directors, I've had the privilege of joining the dream. The sisters who founded Prairiewoods had a bold vision, which created the stretch of land and many of the buildings you see today on the campus. # welcoming new groups

In August 2023, Prairiewoods hosted 65 people for an entire week! Gamaliel—an organization who's mission is to empower ordinary people to effectively participate in the political, environmental, social and economic decisions affecting their lives—taught us so much! We learned how to make REAL sweet tea for southerners that MUST be served on ice. We learned just how important Cholula sauce is to EVERY meal for our Spanish-speaking guests. We held space for gospel hymn fests and yoga classes, intense discussions and joyous celebrations. Every square foot of Prairiewoods was brimming with energy! The heat outside never let up—even as some of the air conditioning gave out and we had to double people up in bedrooms. Our staff and volunteers gave it our all, working extra-long days to take on unfamiliar roles as waitstaff and cook's assistants. At the end of the week, the organizer celebrated with us:"You did it! You weren't sure you could, but you did! It was wonderful!"

## a place to meet 83 groups

hosted their events in meeting spaces at Prairiewoods. ## going solar

In December 2023, Prairiewoods added 70 solar panels to our existing array. This allowed us to go 100% solar, reducing our reliance on fossil fuels and increasing our sustainability. Foundress Nancy Hoffman, FSPA, says, "Many minds, hearts, muscles and donations over the last 30 years have helped to complete this coveted dream to power all of Prairiewoods' buildings with solar energy." In the first six months of relying entirely on solar energy, we offset 21.3 tons of carbon, the equivalent of 2,170 gallons of gas!
