2001 Story and Spiritual Consciousness

We re-connect with God through both science and the spirituality of the poets.

It is the context of today and of all our tomorrows—the agenda that the cosmos itself is revealing. The transformative path of evolution leads us clearly toward deeper awareness and reflective consciousness. We are challenged to take responsibility for the care of the earth, to be compassionate toward all our sisters and brothers.

Prairiewoods celebrates its 25th Anniversary year with a comprehensive sweep of our eco-centric approach to spirituality. Focusing on the Universe Story (Mary Evelyn Tucker and John Grim), we trace the arc of Prairiewoods' founding impetus, placing the universal principles of "interiority, diversity and communion" at the center of our spiritual awareness through the emergent cultivation of "active hope," ala the work of eminent eco-philosopher Joanna Macy (Kathleen Rude), toward the exploration and nurturing of the wider "We" (David Abram). From Prairiewoods' founding until 2021, our mission has been framed with the Universe Story, a 13.7-billion-year journey that celebrates the wild fecundity of life from the Great Flaring Forth forward. As the story continues to unfold, we recognize, celebrate and lean more intentionally into the fullness of life, the journey of the universe that Berry called a "single gorgeous celebratory event."

2022 Spirituality & Stories of the Land

Jim Enote & Sara Thomsen Jim Enote, CEO of the Colorado Plateau Foundation, farmer, Zuni tribal member and thought leader, explores the deep resonance of interior (spiritual) mapping with the land's own stories. Jim's tradition offers a spellbinding account of creation from the perspective of tribal lands, where its deep time journey weaves tales of mysterious emergence, intersecting with humanity's journey of discovery of its embeddedness in the tale of creation. While listening to the land's own stories, we encounter our own interior meanderings, mountains of transformative insight, rivers of energetic flow, forests of profound wonderment, and fissures of fierce brokenness. How the land shifts and groans, wanders and erupts, caresses and lulls, attracts and terrifies is all part of our understanding of our BIG story, the Universe Story and our wider "We."

2023 Weaving a New Story of Meaning

Then we explore the implications of a worldview of deep interconnectedness and discuss an integrated framework for well-being and spiritual groundedness.
